
Semiahmoo Peninsula Rotaract Club

To celebrate Valentine's Day this year, the Semiahmoo Peninsula Rotaract Club took part in our 3rd annual Valentine's Day card writing project to donate 255 cards to the Peace Arch Hospital in White Rock, BC. Typically this is a project that we look forward to spending time together as a club. Complete with snacks, music, and sharing lots of laughs while we write cards together. Even though we couldn't do it the way we are used to, we made the best of it and had a virtual card decorating night! We spent the evening making and writing 255 handmade Valentine's Day cards full of colour, custom designs, and personalized messages. We made the cards to be given to the long-term care residents at the Peace Arch Hospital. Due to visitors not being allowed in the hospitals right now, we delivered the cards to the hospital staff, who then distributed them to the residents. There are 162 residents in the long-term care unit, so there were 93 additional cards that were distributed to other patients in the hospital in need of some extra kindness in their day.



Recently we had a virtual bingo night "Music Through the Decades: Music Bingo" to support the Guatemala Literacy Bus. It was a blast and such a fun way to see everyone virtually, and we were able to raise \$900! Our club is still selling Rotary themed calendars to raise funds for the Starfish Pack Program. This program is for children in school lunch programs. They are provided with a backpack of food that they can take home on weekends. Snohomish County Rotaract Club

Calling all Snohomish County Rotarians, friends, family and neighbors. With the new year well underway the Rotaract Club of Snohomish County is starting up a new project to target hunger in our community. **The Green Bag Project** is America's first neighborhood-based food donation program. Every two months, volunteers go door-to-door picking up food from their neighbors. It's the easiest, most effective, most empowering way to organize community support for local food banks. The Rotaract Club of Snohomish County is interested in implementing this program to serve all 18 food banks in the Snohomish County Food Bank Coalition, but we'll need the help of Rotarians like yourself to make it all possible.



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It's the easiest, most effective, most empowering way to organize community support for local food banks. The program itself is rather simple:

- A volunteer called a "Neighborhood Coordinator" (NC) recruits neighbors to be Food Donors, usually by canvassing. Their "neighborhood" can be any size—a few houses, a whole street, or several blocks.
- When a Food Donor signs up, the NC gives them a reusable green Food Project bag. We suggest that each week, the donor buy one extra nonperishable grocery item while shopping, take it home and store it in the bag
- During the two months between pickups, NCs email or call their Food Donors at least twice to remind them of the date of the next pickup.
- Every two months, on the 2nd Saturday (Feb., April, June...), each donor puts their bag of food outside their front door. The Neighborhood Coordinator picks up all the bags in their neighborhood and leaves thank you cards and empty bags for the next time.
- The Neighborhood Coordinator takes the bags to the local food bank. Volunteers are waiting there to unload the food, weigh it, and distribute or shelve

That's all there is to it. Then it starts all over again. Currently we are looking for food donors and neighborhood coordinators, to be a part of the Snohomish County Food Project. These were great opportunities to meet Rotarians in our community and inform them about our projects. We are now planning different volunteer projects with them and feel like we have their support for our future endeavours. Due to the cold weather, our club was motivated to host a winter clothing dive in the community to help give back to those in need in Bellingham. We had 3 drop off locations throughout Bellingham and all donations went back to members of the community. Our future plans include establishing an official Twin club and having the Mayor of Bellingham come speak at a meeting. We are excited to see where this momentum will take us!






