

Blood donations are important because they are a critical part of everyday medical care including major surgeries, medical procedures, cancer treatments, and disease management. To encourage other members of our community to donate, we offered a Nike prize basket valued at \$350, which was generously donated. Our winner was Matthew Wynne! Congrats Matthew! For several of the members, it was their first time donating blood. For others like Lexie, it was her 11th time donating! The project inspired Ryan to organize his blood drive with a group of SFU students, Kappa Sigma Colony. Club member Ryan says: "I would encourage everyone to go and donate blood if you are eligible - not only do you learn about your blood type and more, but you can help a community of people that you may not even know needs you." For instance, Ryan learned that he has a rare antibody for Cytomegalovirus (CMV) so his blood is given to Cancer patients.


